CLINICAL PLACEMENT FROM WINTEC

A Transformative Journey

Nursing students from WINTEC, Shagun and Alon, recently finished their placement with us in Kimihia. Here's some insights from Shagun Maratha (left):

When I first walked into Kimihia Home and Hospital, I was struck by how warm, calm, and supportive the environment felt.

One of the most valuable lessons I learned during my placement was the importance of communication and observation. Even small changes in a resident's behaviour or mood can mean something significant, and noticing these



early makes a big difference in their care. I'll never forget one resident who shared stories from her younger days. Her gratitude for simple things—like listening and offering a helping hand—showed me how meaningful small acts of kindness really are.

This experience has broadened my understanding of elder care. I now see how holistic it is, involving emotional support, cultural awareness, routines, teamwork, and medical care all working together for residents' wellbeing.

This placement has strengthened my desire to grow in nursing. It helped me gain confidence in clinical tasks, communication, and building rapport with residents. I now feel better prepared for future studies and placements.

My advice to other students is to come with an open mind and a willingness to learn. Ask questions, take initiative, and appreciate even the small learning moments—they truly shape your growth.

If I had to describe my experience in one word, it would be **transformative.**
